I am not gulty of rebellion and future generations will agree with me.









AS PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC SINCE *JANUARY 23, 1899, EMILIO AGUINALDO* ISSUED A DECREE ON JUNE 30, EXTOLLING THE BRAVERY OF THESE SPANIARDS. AFTER A REMARKABLE WELCOME IN MANILA, THEY WERE REPATRIATED TO SPAIN.









It was on June 30 when President Emilio Aguinaldo commended the Spanish soldiers in the siege of Baler for their loyalty and gallantry. To mark this momentous occasion, it is only fitting that the said date be declared a national holiday so that the act of kindness that laid the foundation of improved relations between the Philippines and Spain is remembered. The 30th of June of each year is thus declared a national special working holiday and a special non-working holiday in Aurora Province.

On October 19, 2011, the *Ayuntamiento de Málaga*, the University of Malaga, the *Cámara de Comercio de Málaga*, the *Real Club Mediterráneo*, *Unicaja*, *AECYR* and www.belt.es signed a framework agreement on collaboration in order to give a legal force to the *Foro*, although its activity dates back several years before.

The first clause of the agreement stipulates that the said institutions are aware of the need to search for models that shall guarantee stable co-existence as part of multilateralism where human relations are developed.
