# KF Think Tank Internship

The program provides Korean graduate students with the opportunity to serve as an internat leading policy-research institutions. KF dispatches research interns to prominent institutions to offer opportunities for international experiences for Korea's leaders of tomorrow.

Think Tank Interns are expected to have analytical skills with a strong technical, scientific, or field background in a particular area.

## **KF** Library Internship

The program is designed to provide valuable work experiences and related opportunities at prestigious libraries abroad to young Koreans. Future librarians will be provided with opportunities to upgrade and advance their professional careers as librarians specializing in Korean studies.

Library Interns are expected to be holders of (at least) level -2 librarian certification with an adequate level of English language competency.

## **KF** Museum Internship

The program enables career-minded Korean students majoring in museum-related fields, and junior-level curators to acquire real-life work experiences at world's finest museums. This program provides young Koreans with valuable hands-on experiences at prominent museums abroad.

Museum Interns are expected to be young potential or junior-level professionals (including curators) who have an MA degree or higher, be committed to pursuing a museum career.

# KF Korean Language Education Internship

The program supports Korean language education at overseas universities which provide Korean language courses on a regular credit basis through dispatching graduate students or junior lecturers teaching assistants to Korean language programs at overseas universities

Korean Language Education Interns are expected to (at least) be currently enrolled in a graduate-level degree program in Korean language education as a foreign language or its equivalent academic area with relevant teaching experiences.
