

#### Scientific Goal

This year, the Maria Zambrano Center for Transatlantic Studies has scheduled the **2**<sup>nd</sup> **International Workshop** on 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> of June and its main topic will center around the *Gálvez family, especially focused on the universal figure of Bernardo de Gálvez.* 

The aim of this scientific meeting —in which prestigious researchers and experts from

both national and international universities take part— is to update the knowledge about the relationship between Spain and America nowadays and the influence that the recovery of the figures of the Gálvez family, who played a major role the last years of XVIII century, has on them.

The role of José de Gálvez will be discussed, not only as an inspector (*visitador*) in the Viceroyalty of Spain but mainly as Secretary of State for the Indies since 1776 as well as the role of Matías de Gálvez and his son Bernardo, both Viceroys of Mexico. Their role in the war against Great Britain (1779-1783) —Matías as Governor of Guatemala and Bernardo as Governor of Louisiana— will be also discussed.

A third element present in this edition is the Spanish support to the independence of the thirteen colonies, later known as United States of America. The analysis of the consequences of the American Revolutionary War plays a major role in this gathering: the culprits and the consequences on the relationships between Spain and America throughout the two centuries that has passed.

# Description

Once a year, The Maria Zambrano Center for Transatlantic Studies organizes an international workshop in which experts of different branches of knowledge from both sides of the Atlantic will be able to share their opinions and experiences. The main objective of the gathering is the promotion of an area for discussion, research and knowledge transfer at international level about those questions of greatest interest for the transatlantic countries. These appointments also help building and strengthening the collaboration network that the Maria Zambrano Center for Transatlantic Studies

This is the second international gathering organized by the Center. The first one, called "Spain and America: Crossed Paths. An Interdisciplinary Perspective", which discussed the Euro-American relations from different perspectives and approaches took place last year.

Both the Maria Zambrano Center for Transatlantic Studies UMA – ATECH and the activities organized by them are part of the Strategy for Internationalization of the International Campus of Excellence (ICE) Andalucía TECH.


