Application Steps	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Students coming to UTS on an exchange program <b>MUST be nominated</b> by the home university first.</li> <li>Nominations are accepted through an online survey that UTS will email partner universities before the opening of each round.</li> </ol>		

	<p>3. Students must provide their home university coordinator with a printed copy of their online application form for review and submission.</p> <p>4. The home institution must email the following items to <a href="mailto:saex.applications@uts.edu.au">saex.applications@uts.edu.au</a>:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Application PDF</li> <li>- Evidence of English proficiency (where required)</li> <li>- Academic transcript</li> </ul> <p><b>Note:</b> Students applying for exchange cannot apply directly through our website (the application is for fee-paying Study Abroad students only).</p> <p>We do not require the hardcopy of any application documents, unless specifically requested. Documents not issued in English must be accompanied by an English translation (both original and translation are required).</p>

### SPECIAL NOTE ON COVID-19 FOR AUTUMN 2022 APPLICANTS

COVID-19	<p>Given that the global response to COVID-19 is continuing to evolve, we recommend that Autumn 2022 applicants do not purchase airline tickets or make significant deposits for accommodation etc. until they have their Australian visa.</p> <p>The Australian government has not yet:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Formally notified us when borders will reopen.</li> <li>• Clarified its requirements for safe international arrivals (which may include quarantine, vaccination documentation etc).</li> </ul> <p>We will continue to be in close contact with partners and students in the lead up to the semester with more information as it comes to hand.</p>

### OSHC

OSHC	<p>All student visa holders are required to purchase Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) except Belgian, Norwegian and some Swedish students who are exempt as outlined on the <a href="#">Department of Home Affairs website</a>. We recommend <a href="#">Medibank Private</a>, however students may see <a href="#">other providers here</a>.</p> <p><b>Note:</b> Students will be sent instructions on how to purchase OSHC when they received an offer to study at UTS. We do not purchase OSHC on behalf of students.</p>

### COE and Student Visas

COE and Student Visas	<p>Once a student has accepted their full offer, UTS will issue a Confirmation of Enrolment (COE) which the student must use to obtain their Student visa (subclass 500) through the <a href="#">Department of Home Affairs</a> (Please note that due to COVID, a COE will <b>NOT</b> be issued by UTS until either a) the Australian Government confirms that the Australian Border will open to International students or b) by 1<sup>st</sup> November 2021, whichever occurs earlier).</p> <p><b>Note:</b> CoE documentation must be checked thoroughly by the student before applying for a visa. UTS is not liable for any additional visa changes or extensions costs.</p>

## Subjects and Enrolment

<b>Subjects advice</b>	<p>Students are strongly encouraged to choose between 6 to 8 subject options (maximum 10) for their application. The session and prerequisites of each subjects should be carefully checked. The tools below will assist students with their subject selections.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The <a href="#">Study Abroad and Exchange Subject Guides</a> provide an overview of popular subjects and guidance on how to navigate the online Handbook.</li> <li>Under the sections '<i>Researching subjects</i>' and '<i>Tips for selecting subjects</i>' on the <a href="#">Subject and academic information page</a>, students can find helpful resources and videos explaining how to use the subject guides, UTS Handbook and UTS Timetable.</li> </ul> <p><b>Note:</b> Subjects from the following Programs are generally not available for Study Abroad students: Nursing; clinical and education placements; Midwifery; all Graduate Health subjects; Master of Clinical Psychology; MBA Executive; Chinese Medicine; Engineering internships. Animation and Media Arts Production have limited availability.</p>
<b>Teaching Locations</b>	<p>UTS has two campuses;</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) <a href="#">City Campus</a> in Ultimo where the majority of subjects are taught and</li> <li>2) <a href="#">Moore Park Precinct</a> where some Sport and Exercise Science and Management subjects will be based.</li> </ol> <p><b>Note:</b> Travel time between locations should be considered when selecting subjects. Student can use the new <a href="#">light rail service</a> between campuses.</p>
<b>Conditions for Subject Approvals and Enrolment</b>	<p>Subject approval and final enrolment into subjects is conditional upon class availabilities, the student meeting prerequisites, and completion of the online enrolment process. Students must also check the <a href="#">UTS Timetable Planner</a> to avoid subject clashes.</p>
<b>Enrolment FAQs</b>	<p>Common questions about enrolment and timetabling have been addressed in our <a href="#">Enrolment FAQ</a> page.</p>

## UTS Housing and Living in Sydney

<b>UTS On-Campus Housing</b>	<p><a href="#">UTS Housing</a> provides a stress-free, fun and supported study environment, just a few minutes from class. Living in the city center everything is a short walk, and the beach is only a bus ride away. UTS housing aspires to be 25% cheaper than similar housing options in Sydney. Sourcing decent, affordable accommodation in Sydney is <u>highly competitive</u>. If a student is given a housing offer, but does not receive a full offer of admission to UTS, they will be refunded the acceptance fee and bond. As such students are strongly encouraged to apply for housing as soon as they receive their student number with their application acknowledgement.</p>

### UTS Transcripts on Completion

<b>UTS Transcripts</b>	<p>UTS issues transcripts to all students approximately one month after exam results are released. These will be uploaded to the <a href="#">Myequals platform</a> unless a student chooses to opt out. The students will then share the link to their home university and/or agent. Students who opt out will be issued a hard copy of the transcript.</p> <p><b>Note:</b> The official UTS transcript does not carry a stamp or signature. Instead, it carries a security feature in the paper (UTS is written in tiny letters across the whole paper) and a "COPY" watermark will appear if the transcript is copied.</p>
