Synopsis:

The conference *Stories of Trauma*: Post-Memory of Women in the Time of Dictatorship proposes a reflection on the intersection between trauma and post-memory, exploring how perspectives, discourses and contemporary artistic creations in Portugal and Andalusia engage, emotionally and politically, with the legacies of the Iberian dictatorships of the 20th century. Far from a direct representation of these regimes, this artistic investigation examines how creative artists from neighboring regions address the traumatic past through narratives that intertwine lived experiences and inherited memories. Through testimonies, objects, and images, the artists confront the reverberations of violence that have lasted for generations, challenging the silence that still weighs on these memories today.

In this context, contemporary art reflects on the transmission of trauma and the direct experience of violence-from domestic violence to sexual repression, from harassment to rape, from labor exploitation to inequalities in fundamental human rights. Natalist policies, deeply rooted in Catholic morality, have marginalized women, denying them sexual and reproductive autonomy. Furthermore, these forms of oppression have been intensified by identity factors such as sexual orientation, race, ethnicity, class, and economic status. The project proposes an intersectional approach to these issues.

One of its objectives is to highlight the continued marginalization of feminist art in Southern Europe, which is often ignored by the canon of international art historiographies.

Central questions:

- How to create an artistic archive that reveals counter-narratives and amplifies the voices of silenced women?
- How can we transform this "sensitive material" into a shared cultural heritage that benefits the community and promotes gender equality?
- How can we approach the post-memory of trauma without falling into an irresponsible, voyeuristic, or opportunistic exploitation of other people's pain?
