I. JAPANESE LANGUAGE AND CULTURE PROGRAM	
Course outline	We offer Japanese language courses according to students' individual levels (6 levels from beginner to advanced), as well as Japanese culture courses , such as <i>Kado</i> (Art of Flower Arrangement), <i>Shodo</i> (Calligraphy), and Japanese Culture, that put emphasis on practical experience.

Notes	Students with advanced Japanese proficiency can take some designated undergraduate courses, along with Japanese Language and Culture courses.
Qualification for applicants	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Exchange students must have completed twelve years of mandatory education and be eligible to enter university, or the equivalent. - Exchange students must have achieved grades of at least 75 points on a 100-point scale, or a 2.75 GPA on a 4.00 scale at their host universities.

II. NON-DEGREE SEEKING UNDERGRADUATE COURSES TAUGHT IN ENGLISH	
Course outline	The student will belong to the Faculty of Global Communication and take courses taught in English.

Credits	Exchange students must earn at least 14 ASU credits per semester.
Qualification for applicants	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • English proficiency shall be equivalent to TOEFL iBT 71, IELTS 5.5 (CEFR B2 Level) or above for non-native English speakers. *It is not mandatory to submit the official score report of TOEFL or IELTS. In case the student applicant does not have the official score report, an official letter from home university which certifies that her/his English proficiency is equivalent or beyond the abovementioned requirement will serve. • Grade F (Fail) must be less than 10% of the total academic results at the last educational institution.
Notes	Japanese courses “Introductory Japanese 1” and “Introductory Japanese 2” (90 minutes per lecture for 15 weeks; 2 credits) are available for the students.
Important notice	Although the courses are taught in English, students may often face difficulty in their daily life communication with people who do not understand English and/or making sense of signs when English descriptions are not available (including on campus). It is not required for applicants to have Japanese language background, but we recommend them to study basic Japanese before their departure, in order to make their student life easier.

Course outline	Students can choose to take courses taught in Japanese across faculties/departments. However, the course should be eligible for non-degree-seeking students.

Credits	Exchange students must earn at least 14 ASU credits per semester.		
Qualification for applicants	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The student must obtain the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) N1 (Level 1). - Grade F (Fail) must be less than 10% of the total academic results at the last educational institution. 		
Notes	“Japanese Academic Writing for non-native speakers” (90 minutes per lecture for 15 weeks; 2 credits) is available for students of this category.

INFORMATION UPON ARRIVAL (in chronological order)	
Student visa	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Accepted exchange student will receive a “Certificate of Admission” from Aichi Shukutoku University (ASU hereafter). 2. ASU will apply for the “Certificate of Eligibility (CoE)” to Nagoya Regional Immigration Bureau on behalf of the student. The certificate will be sent out to the partner university or the exchange student immediately after its issuance. 3. Student must apply for a student visa at the nearest embassy or consulate of Japan with the “Certificate of Admission”, “Certificate of Eligibility,” a copy of the “Written Pledge for Residence Track” and her/his passport.
Fix arrival date	<p>Exchange student is required to enter Japan only after obtaining student visa. The period of visa application may vary depending on countries/regions.</p> <p>ASU will send out the “Certificate of Eligibility” one week before the pick-up dates at the latest. Please arrange your flight carefully, considering the time required for visa application procedure.</p>
Airport pick-up service ※subject to change	<p>This service is available, at no cost, for the arrival at Chubu Centrair International Airport, only on the designated dates as follows; 15 and 16 March 2022.</p>
Self-quarantine requirement	<p>Depending on the border enforcement measure of Japanese government at the time, student might be required to undergo self-quarantine (in designated accommodation) for 2 weeks after the arrival in Japan at student’s own cost.</p>
Accommodation Webpage of iHouse	<p>Exchange students are requested to live in our on-campus dormitory for international students (called ‘iHouse’).</p> <p>Exchange students can check in iHouse from 29 to 31 March 2022.</p> <p>https://www.aasa.ac.jp/institution/ihouse/en/</p>
Basic Room Facilities at iHouse	<p>All are private rooms.</p> <p>Single bed frame with mattress and bed sheets, desk and chair, desk lamp, refrigerator, air conditioner (warm and cold), cabinet, closet, safe, curtains, wired internet connection</p> <p>*You need to bring the LAN cable.</p>

Shared Facilities at iHouse	Kitchens, living and dining room, common study room, mini lounges, shower rooms, lavatory, laundry rooms (with washing machines and dryers), vending machine, Wi-Fi connection (*shared area on the 2nd and 3rd floor only)
Expenses for accommodation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Damage deposit: 40,000 JPY *Refundable pending the condition of the accommodations at the time of moving out. - Residence fee: 20,000 JPY/month - Maintenance fee: 5,000 JPY/month - Electricity bill: depends on your monthly usage (approximately 1,000 JPY/month) - Cleaning expense: 5,000 JPY to be paid when the student moves out
Estimated cost of living in Japan	<p>Living expenses depend on the student's lifestyle; the average cost of living is 60,000 yen per month including expenses for accommodation and meals. There is no canteen within the student dormitory, and there is no meal plan available; students need to prepare your own meals.</p> <p>*General Information on cost of living in Japan: https://www.studyinjapan.go.jp/en/life/livingcost-price/ (JASSO Study in Japan: "Living Cost and Price")</p>
Health insurance	<p>Exchange students MUST purchase the following three insurances:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) 1-month overseas travel insurance (purchase in your home country) *This is the requirement for entering Japan. 2) National Health Insurance – NHI (purchase in Japan) NHI covers 70% of the total medical expenses when one receives treatment at any medical institutions. The annual insurance premium is approximately ¥17,000 on average. 3) 'Personal accident insurance for student pursuing education and research' and 'Liability Insurance' (purchase in Japan) <p>These insurances cover unexpected accident and injuries incurred while engaging in educational and research activities on and off campus. The insurance premium is ¥1,140 per year. The premium is the same for the exchange students who would stay for only one semester.</p>

Scholarship opportunity	ASU Alumni Scholarship: This scholarship, awarded on a basis of academic achievement at ASU, is given to international students at the end of each semester. Exchange students who study at ASU for one academic year (or more) are eligible to apply for this scholarship. *Please note that exchange students who study only one semester are not eligible. Stipend: ¥100,000 Qualifications: <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Applicant must be enrolled at ASU upon receiving the scholarship.- Applicant must obtain a student visa.

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
