APPLICATION PROCESS	<p>Send nomination by the deadline to Diana Ramirez dramirez@law.pace.edu</p> <p>All exchange applicants must submit these supporting documents:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Nomination form• A full academic transcript from your law school;• English score (if applicable)• A short statement of approximately 500 words, explaining why you want to participate in the exchange program and what you hope to learn as a visiting student at Pace Law. <p>Once nominated and accepted by Pace University, the students will receive an acceptance letter.</p>

ENROLLMENT	<p>Exchange students will receive instructions on how to access the MyPace Portal there they will have information about Pace activities, events, and news. In addition, the Portal will give you access to your email, courses, accounts, registration and grades.</p> <p>Registration for fall: May (registration will remain open and students may make changes until the first week of classes)</p> <p>Registration for Spring: November (Registration will remain open and students may make changes until the first week of January)</p>

HEALTH INSURANCE AND IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS	<p>Like most colleges and universities in the United States, Pace University has a mandatory health insurance policy for international students.</p> <p>Please note that all full-time and part-time international students (F-1, J-1, J-2 and other visa statuses) are automatically enrolled in the University's international student health insurance program.</p> <p>To review the up to date fees please go to: https://www.pace.edu/health-insurance/international-students</p> <p>New York State Public Health Law requires that all college and university students enrolled for at least six (6) semester hours or the equivalent per semester, or at least four (4) semester hours per quarter to submit proof/documentation of immunization for measles, mumps, rubella, and meningococcal disease. HOUSING INFORMATION

Dannat Hall is located on the Law School campus and houses up to 104 residents. All rooms are single occupancy and furnished. Large units are furnished with a full-sized bed, two closets, two dressers, a large desk and office chair, a nightstand, and a small table with two chairs. Small units are furnished with a twin-sized bed, one dresser, a desk and an office chair, and a nightstand. Windows in each unit are covered with mini-blinds, and residents share common, single-sex bathrooms on each wing of the floors. Dannat Hall is also equipped with wireless internet, and a lounge on every floor. The basement has a community kitchen, a laundry room, and fitness room. The Office of Residential Life will open the housing application process in June. All admitted students will be sent an email with a link to the online housing application and deadline information to request space in Dannat Hall. There are many off-campus housing opportunities within walking distance of our campus. Students may also wish to consider towns on the Metro-North Harlem train line, as they connect

easily to White Plains. The law school campus is located in White Plains, right outside of NYC, a little north of the Bronx.

It's very accessible through Metro-North, with 30 minute commute approximately from Grand Central station in Manhattan to White Plains Station.

If you wish to live along the metro-north line the commute is not that hard.

In Manhattan, it makes several stops. Grand Central, 125th Street (Harlem), Melrose (Close to Yankee Stadium), Tremont (Bronx), Fordham (Bronx) etc. [Metro-North Railroad](#)

There are also several other stops along the way and closer to White Plains that are easily accessible, like Bronxville, Scarsdale, or Hartsdale. A lot of our students stay also in the White Plains area.

We also have a PACE shuttle (free) that comes and goes from the metro station in White Plains to the law school.
