Eligibility			
GPA Requirement	There is no minimum GPA requirement to participate in the exchange program. However, students must meet the standards set by their home institution to study abroad.		
Language Requirement	<ul> <li>Courses taught in English</li> <li>Students are not required to submit proof of English Language Proficiency.</li> <li>However, students from non-English speaking countries are recommended to have English proficiency scores equivalent to or higher than TOEFL iBT79 (PBT 550) or IELTS 6.5.</li> <li>Courses taught in Korean</li> <li>Students are not required to submit proof of Korean Language proficiency.</li> <li>However, it is highly recommended that students have Korean Proficiency equivalent to or higher than TOPIK level 4, in order to take courses conducted in Korean.</li> </ul>

Course Load per Semester	<ul> <li>Undergraduate: 3-19 credits (minimum-maximum)</li> <li>Graduate: 3-15 credits (minimum-maximum)</li> <li>In general, courses at Soongsil are three-credit courses. 1 Credit hour indicates 16 classroom hours per semester.</li> <li>In general, a 3 credit course is converted to 6 ECTS.</li> </ul>			
Courses taught in English	<ul> <li>Around 15% of the courses are taught in English.</li> <li>Students can take courses across all majors with an exception to courses that are specifically restricted to exchange students.</li> <li>Undergraduate students are not allowed to take graduate courses. However, graduate students are allowed to take both undergraduate and graduate courses, and need to get permission from professor in advance to take graduate</li> </ul>

Visa / Immigration	
Visa to Korea	<ul> <li>Exchange students have to apply for a visa (D-2-6) prior to their arrival in Korea.</li> <li>Students need to take the documents included in their acceptance package to the local Korean Embassy or Consulate and apply for visa.</li> <li>Required documents for visa application <ul> <li>Certificate of Admission</li> <li>Letter of Acceptance</li> <li>Certificate of Business Registration of Soongsil University</li> </ul> </li> <li>Additional documents may be required depending on the student's place of residence. Please contact the local Korean Embassy or Consulate and check the documents required for visa application.</li> <li>It is strongly recommended that students plan ahead and apply for their visa as soon as they receive their acceptance packages. Without a valid visa, students may have to cancel their exchange semester at Soongsil University.</li> </ul>
Alien Registration	Upon arrival, all exchange students must apply for Alien Registration. All foreigners intending to stay in Korea for more than 90 days are subject to Alien Registration. Soongsil OIA will assist students with Alien Registration when the semester begins.

Insurance ** Government insurance policy has been changed from March 1 <sup>st</sup> , 2021.	1. 2.	<ul> <li>Exchange students at Soongsil University have a D-2 visa and must have two insurances: Korean National Health Insurance and Personal Insurance.</li> <li>All exchange students(D-2 Visa) will be required to sign up for the national health insurance from their alien registration date.</li> <li>National Health Insurance fee is around KRW 45,000 per month. (70% reduced price temporarily)</li> </ul>			



	<ul> <li>The bill will be sent to the address listed on student's alien registration card every month.</li> <li>Even if students are covered by the National Health Insurance, they must purchase an overseas insurance from their home country or a private insurance guided by Soongsil University. Koreans also subscribe both private insurance and national health insurance because there is a coverage that the national health insurance cannot cover. Exchange students also have to sign up for <b>both</b>.</li> </ul>
