Through half a century, Kyungsung University's development still continues.

The university was established by the late Reverend Dr. Kim Gil-Chang, a pioneer of Christianity in Korea. The university was originally called Kyungnam Teacher's College was established in 1955 under the ideals of Christian love and service. In 1979 the school was re-organized and renamed Pusan Industrial University. At the time of the founding of Pusan Industrial University, the General Construction Committee of the school began work on expanding and improving the quality of the university's facilities. As a result, the university received official sanctioning as a general university in September, 1983. The name of the university was changed to Kyungsung University in 1988 during the process of becoming an international university which can fulfill the needs of today's society.

The university has 10 undergraduate colleges (Liberal Arts, Law and Politics, Commerce and Economics, Science, Engineering, Pharmacy, Arts, Theology, Multimedia, and Chinese) in 2011 encompassing 7 different faculties and 54 departments (In 2011, the maximum freshmen enrollment will be 3,120 students).

There are seven graduate schools (General, International Management, Multimedia, Education, Social Welfare, Clinical Pharmacy, and Digital Design). In addition, seven affiliated organizations and seven affiliated research institutes have been established to aid teaching and research. Kyungsung University's 700 employees and over 13,000 students are all working together to achieve the school's educational goals.

Kyungsung University was selected as a Training Group for Visual Image and CT Human Resources for the "Nuri" project by the Ministry of Education and Human Resources. The departments such as multimedia, CT, visual CT are participating in the project.

Universal Design Foundation Establishment Project

Kyungsung University was selected to receive intensive support by the Korea Institute of Design Promotion (KIDP). The project to establish the foundation of universal design in the design section started as part of the projects of the industrial technology foundation in the year 2004.

▶ Local Community Culture Research Center

As our university was selected for intensive support of the local-culture research center by the Korea Culture & Content Agency, the city of Busan will have an opportunity to be promoted in a new Hanryu cultural contents plan and production including animation through drama and music records.

► Organic LEC Development Program

Kyungsung University was supported by the national treasury from Ministry of Commerce, Industry and Energy valued at 2.4 Billion KRW for three years from 2004 to 2007 and it set the goal for Busan city to be fostered as an industrial mecca of organic LED components and materials through the development of core technology of an organic LED sector, the development of human resources for the research and the establishment of R & D information network at home and abroad.

Student convenience facilities include the departmental meeting rooms, men's and women's lounge areas in each college, club meeting rooms, and student council offices. Throughout the years many kinds of academic and artistic festivals are held to enhance school spirit and to further the ideals of the university. The Daedong Festival is held each year around May 30, the anniversary of the founding of Kyungsung University. Each department also holds its own "Fall Festival" during the fall semester. Various volunteer service activities are carried out by student groups including volunteer agricultural service three times every year during the spring, summer, and fall.

Student club activities are especially dynamic. There are 78 different student clubs with over 4,500 participating students. Types of student clubs range from artistic performances, volunteer service groups, and academic clubs, as well as religious and athletic groups. These student clubs also have festivals related to the different cultural and artistic interests of each club.



U-Square

The U-square based in the central library holds passion and challenge to make dreams come true, offering various kinds of services such as information, academic study and relaxation. There is a specialized zone to support job-seeking students, as well as group study and seminar. In addition, DVD corners are available for couples and friends, and can search for a variety of academic data, refresh themselves at the information search and web surfacing corners.





The Sports Center is equipped with a swimming pool, fitness center, squash court and aerobic room. The swimming pool is clean and with national level swimming coaches who provide classes. The fitness center is popular not only among undergraduates but also with the community as it is furnished with state-of-the art machines. The Sports Center in which female and male students improve their health togethe while listening to cheerful music is where Kyungsung University's powerful energy is released.





Nuri Dormitory

The Nuri Student Living House, Kyungsung University's dormitory, was built to attract excellent students who are from the suburbs and to correspond with the new image of the university of a high-quality institution. The 15-story Nuri Student Living House can accommodate around 660 students in 330 rooms. Each room can accomodate two students and is designed with a deluxe bathroom, HVAC and refrigerator so that students can enjoy the most pleasant and comfortable campus life. As subsidiary facilities, there are a fitness center, a table tennis room, laundry rooms for men and women, dining room holding up to 400 people, a convenient store, a post office, a student lounge, an internet cafe, a party room, a students' autonomy office, a language lecture room, a conference room and an assembly hall. Besides, rest rooms, meditation rooms and reading rooms are provided on every third floor respectively.

Also, on the 15th floor, a guest room designed for foreign visitors not only attracts foreign students, but also contributes to revitalization of international interchange in the future.

Kyungsung University educates qualified students who create their future.


Seven annexes including the main library serve as a foundation for each student to be a sound person, as well as creative practical.

Central Library

The central library collects, arranges and preserve various domestic and international data and information which are needed for scientific research and study. It functions as a body to help Kyungsung University students achieve their educational objects effectively. It includes the Office of Academic Information Support and Office of Academic Information Services.

Information & Computing Center

This center plays a role in managing the university's information system, which is basic to achieve the university's educational purpose. The institute is responsible for the development and promotion of the information-oriented policy and the support of other computerization required-tasks. In March 2006, the Center for Teaching & Learning was established.



The School of Continuing Education supports social education to promote self-development and better qualifications. The center operates the Social Education Department that practices lifelong education in the community. The other departments under the center are the Language Education Department that endeavors to help globally qualified students and the Sports Center for the students and community residents.

Career Development & Employment Department

The Career Development & Employment Department Office assists students' course development and their adaptation to society by problem-solving skills during campus life and classes. The department provides various information and data for employment as well as for avocations and consulting sessions while conducting researches to acquire information in related fields of study.

Bird Museum

The Bird Museum exhibits storks, a natural treasure, and stuffed birds that once inhabited Korea but are now extinct. The museum also carries other valuable specimens of 270 birds, 70 eggs and some bird nests found in Korea.

University Museum

The University Museum unearths, exhibits and researches significant data needed for restoring the history of 'the Kaya' culture and has contributed to its history and succession and preservation of traditional culture. It also collects and exhibits Korean traditional folk materials.

Multimedia Communication Center

The Multimedia Communication Center (MCC) promotes close communication between study members through media activities supporting multi-media related creative activities by making various media centralized along with the cutting edge system.

Cultural Performance Facilities


The cultural performance facilities at Kyungsung University are equipped with state of the art sound and lighting systems as well as multimedia presentation equipment. Since Opening in September 1983, the 499 seat Concert Hall has played an important role in the local culture community. The Small Theater and Small Lecture Hall, which opened with the Multimedia and Information Building in November 1997, are used not only for classes and lectures, but also for a variety of performances, movies, and seminars.



Exhibition Facilities

The exhibition facilities of Kyungsung University consist of the Exhibition Hall of Wild Birds, the Art Gallery, and the University Museum. The Exhibition Hall of Wild Birds is located on the B1 level of the Multimedia and Information Building. There are over 1000 specimens representing 270 different species of bird, most of which are native to Korea. Specimens of eggs and nests are also preserved here, along with many rare documents. It has become a popular destination for many students on nature field trips. The Art Gallery was one of the first university museums in the country to be registered as a first-class art museum. It is equipped with the latest lighting facilities. Besides providing a space for artistic research and production, the Art Gallery also has many special exhibitions. The University Museum opened in March 1972 and serves as a research center for Kaya culture. In the exhibition room one can get a feeling for the roots of Korean culture by viewing objects dating from the Stone Age through the Chosun Dynasty.

Introduction

The College of Liberal Arts plays a central role in providing a humanities based education that is essential for maintaining a healthy and vibrant society. To this end it constantly improves teaching methods with a view to new era in education. The curriculum is designed to include various cultural elements and maintain a strong sense of Korean self-identity. The emphasis on humanities helps students develop their creativity, individual capabilities, level of consciousness, and thinking in a versatile manner.



Departments and Majors

Department of Korean Language and Literature

The Department of Korean Language and Literature teaches both Korean language and literature. Since language and literature are not fixed but change depending on time and location, students need to understand various historical opinions and views. The department aims to improve creative thinking and writings, not just an understanding and embracing of Korean language and literature. The curriculum is divided into Korean linguistics and Korean literature. Through recent linguistic theories, students study vocabulary needed in everyday life, as well as cultural phenomena reflected by it.

Department of English Language and Literature

The main educational objective of the English department is mastering the four skills (listening, reading, speaking & writing) of English. To achieve this goal, students learn the structural features and developmental processes of English, matched with practical applications of these skills outside the classroom. Apart from analyzing the linguistic aspects of English, students will also read and analyze both British and American literature. Students will have a genuine chance to experience the essence of British and American culture as well as enhance their linguistic ability. Through this approach, the English Department believes that students will appreciate the value of the English language not only as a tool for international communication, but also as a significant cultural phenomenon in the world today. The ultimate goal is to educate students to be globalized elites with a balanced world perspective.

Department of German Studies

Germany is one of the major economic and industrial powers in the EU and the world. Therefore, research and an understanding of Germany are required to meet various changes in international affairs. The Department of German Studies aims at cultivating people of ability with a strong command of practical German who are well informed of German speaking areas like Germany, Austria and Switzerland. This is aided by excellent professors, renovated curricula and the newest educational facilities.

Department of French Studies

The educational goal of the Department of French Studies is the nurturing of specialists well versed in French studies. Effort is concentrated on practical French education. Research is performed in various domains for the comprehension of French studies: politics, economy, society, geography, history, culture and art. Therefore, not only does the department offer a practical dimension for the nurturing of specialists on French studies , but also new perspectives and ideals for the future as well.

Department of Japanese Language & Literature

The Department of Japanese Language & Literature offers a curriculum focused on improving social and communication skills. It aims to help students acquire an excellent command of Japanese. Since 1980, our department has produced approximately 800 graduates who have won nationwide reputations due to success in the workplace.

Department of Korean Literature in Classical Chinese

Students learn Korean classical literature written in Chinese characters. By teaching Chinese characters and the grammar of Korean written in Chinese characters, the department helps students to understand Korean history, allowing them to be confident and competent and thus able to contribute to the cultural development of Korean society.

Department of History

Through an academic approach to Korean, East Asian and Western histories, the Department of History enables students to realize the position of modern society in the course of human history. The departments aim at fostering national awareness as much as global citizenship and developing knowledge and adaptability suitable for the period of globalization. In addition, a wide-ranging understanding of historical fields (politics, society, economy, and culture.) extends the intellectual horizon, and logical research in historical studies develops the power of reasonable thinking. Furthermore, field investigations of historical sites develop pragmatic attitudes connecting theory and practice so as to ultimately build up abilities and virtue necessary for today's world.

Department of Philosophy

Department of Library and Information Science

Department of Education

Preparing effective teachers, leaders, and researchers; conducting and applying research; and offering accessible local and global outreach. The Department of Education at Kyungsung University emphasizes field-based study in educational settings where social, economic, and political pressures interact to help shape policies and practices. Department of Early Childhood Education

The total number of enrolled students is approximately 150, including 30 regularly-admitted students, students with special admission and double major students. After graduation, most work as teachers at kindergartens and day care centers. Graduate programs, consisting of master's (both in-service and pre-service) and doctorate programs, are available to nurture and develop future leaders in early childhood education and academic research.

Department of Ethics Education

As part of the College of Education, this department aims to develop teachers of ethics in middle and high school. The instruction of character, morality and citizenship to students from 7thto 12th grade is a sacred trust which ensures the future of our country. Department of Physical Therapy



The completion of the Engineering Building also played a major role in this with its state of the art technical facilities providing a new impetus for advancement. In addition, the Computer Engineering Department received the highest national ranking in the field of computer science. All of this success ensures a bright future for both the university and the department.



Departments and Majors

School of Computer Science & Engineering · Computer Engineering · Computer and Information Engineering

Two former departments in Kyungsung University, the Department of Computer and Information Science, established in 1984, and the Department of Computer Engineering, established in 1989, were combined in 2010 to form the School of Computer Science and Engineering in an effort to create leaders in the current IT-based knowledge and information age. More than 600 students are enrolled in the school, making it the largest academic section of the university. The school provides all levels of degrees, BS, MS, and PhD. Theory and practice in computer hardware and software are taught to train highly creative IT professionals. Courses include fundamentals in computer engineering, programming language, mobile programming, embedded system, artificial intelligence, computer network and system, and multimedia and entertainment.

School of Architecture

Architecture is a program that studies the environments that develop human life by combining humanities, arts, science and other aspects of knowledge. This major offers two kinds of educational program: the architectural design program prepares student to become professional architects; and the general architecture program that encompasses a wider range of architecture.

Major in Architectural Design

The Major in Architectural Design offers a 5 year-degree to develop professional architects through intensive programs focusing on design studios in achieving humanities comprehension, art practice and scientific knowledge in order to be eligible for an architect license.

Major in Architecture

The General Architecture major offers a 4 year-degree program that guides students to become public officials or other professionals, as well as to more advance degrees, by acquiring specialized knowledge regarding architectural planning and history, design, structure, environment and construction.

Department of Food Science & Biotechnology

The Department of Food Science & Biotechnology was founded in 1979 and has trained many capable students. Food is an essential material for human growth as well as for the maintenance of human health and life. The food industry plays a major role in industry, and, thus, is one of the most promising fields in the 21 century. This department provides education and research on food and biotechnology regarding the basic science and industrial production technology. In addition, we provide on-site practice-based education including manufacturing technology, product development, quality control, food hygiene, and unit operation, as well as basic and practical study of functional foods, processed foods, food palatability, microorganism, fermentation, enzyme, functional proteins, or bioactive compounds.

Department of Industrial and Management Engineering

Industrial & Management Engineering is considered important for all the industries in the advent of the 21st century information age as it pursues development, improvement, and evaluation of integrated industrial systems consisting of people, money, information, equipment, energy and materials. The goal of the department is to study and apply systematic methodologies for planning, design, and operation to optimize the reliability and performance of industrial systems. The subjects the department offers include operations research, statistics, and computer programming as basic subjects. It also offers technology management, production management, work study, facility planning, quality management, reliability analysis, simulation, factory automation, artificial intelligence, product design and development, logistics, ergonomics as applied subjects. Theory and practical training provided in the systematically organized courses train the best industrial & management engineers, thereby improving productivity and quality, and saving costs in complex industrial systems.

Department of Environmental Engineering

The Department of Environmental Engineering has performed a leading role in resolving the problems of environmental pollution and educating prospective environmental engineers since its establishment in 1984. The objectives of the undergraduate program are to educate students to be highly competent environmental engineers and to research pollution abatement technologies. The environmental engineering program covers water supply, water and wastewater treatment, air pollution, solid and hazardous waste management, land geological pollution protection, and earth environmental system. The environmental engineering program acquired the accreditation of ABEEK (Accreditation Board for Engineering Education of Korea) in 2010 to assure and enhance the quality of educational programs in environmental engineering.

Department of Civil Engineering

Civil Engineering is an academic branch of academics which improves and maintains nature and the environment and makes life more convenient. It has a long history, as well as modern cutting-edge applications, as the way to construct basic social facilities of a country. It deals with planning, design, construction and maintenance of structures such as roads, rails, dams, ports, airports, subways, bridge, plants and water and sewages facilities which constitute the basic infrastructure for human civilized activities. As a means of studying relevant theories and techniques, this can be a fascinating major that can give students a feeling of accomplishment if they are interested in the public good. In the Kyungsung University Department of Civil Engineering, four laboratories allow students to get site specific engineering experiences and have a more fruitful campus life, thus giving undergraduate students chances to participate in civil engineering research activity.

Department of Advanced Materials Engineering

The Department of Advanced Materials Engineering at Kyungsung University was officially formed in 1986. The department has established a curriculum that will provide future generations of responsible material engineers. Our undergraduate program takes a systematic approach in providing fundamental principles in physics, chemistry, materials science and manipulating metals, ceramics, polymers, and electronic materials. The graduates of our department play a central role in the domestic material engineering industry.

Department of Electrical Engineering

The Department of Electrical Engineering is one of the collaborative and interdisciplinary departments in the College of Engineering since the application of electrical engineering has strong ties to many industries. Fundamental knowledge of electrical engineering has contributed to other engineering departments such as mechanical, advanced materials, civil, environmental and architecture engineering. The department's curriculum is specialized to student academic backgrounds and practical skills in sub-topics

categorized as: power delivery & conversion, control for estimation and decision, electrical rotating machines, power electronics, and electronic materials and plasma discharge. All faculty members in the department have been focusing on improving the quality of education to allow each student to become a creative engineer in his or her own specialty. As a result, various laboratory courses have been included in the curriculum to increase hands-on experience, and several prerequisites such as microprocessor, CAD, and computer programming are available to meet students' needs and future objectives. In addition, due to a boost for the need for high-quality education, a program for systematically optimizing all courses in the department was established in 2007. The program is aimed at making courses more coherent and design-oriented. In particular, there are many possibilities for students to participate in research projects sponsored by industry or in academic studies advised by a faculty member, activities which will enrich students' careers and motivate students to find better jobs.

Department of Urban Design and Development Engineering

Urban engineering is an interdisciplinary discipline, which is closely associated with urban planning, urban design, urban development, urban information systems, transportation planning, real estimate, and social science. Founded in 1998, the Department of Urban Engineering at Kyungsung University has provided students with practical skills, as well as academic knowledge, through a well-organized practical management education curriculum. The department offers a unique and stimulating learning environment, where students are encouraged to achieve academic success through exposure to a diversity of viewpoints on urban regeneration and urban reservation. Our department also provides students with a specialized curriculum for successful careers with a focus on urban innovation and societal impact.

Department of Mechatronics Engineering

The Mechatronics Department is aimed at educating skilled and talented professional to be future leaders in the field of mechatronics. 
Department of Electronic Engineering

We educate students to be specialized in developing high-speed wireless communication technology, high-speed optical communication technology, digital communication networks, multimedia terminals and devices, and multimedia processors. In addition, the department nurtures professionals in researching and developing the technologies for establishing on-line systems based on client-server systems that provide data processing, saving and searching through networks.

College of Pharmacy



Introduction

The College of Pharmacy was founded in March 1982 with the goal of serving human welfare through the training of qualified pharmacists and pharmaceutical researchers. Since that time it has grown continuously. To make the curriculum more efficient, multimedia and audio-visual techniques are actively employed. Students also have internships at pharmacies and drug companies. The school has expanded the program to six years. A new pharmacy building with excellent educational facilities opened in 1999.

Departments and Majors

College of Pharmacy

The College of Pharmacy offers a B. S. program in pharmacy. This program gives students a basic background in medicinal chemistry, pharmacology, microbiology, biochemistry, hygienic chemistry, analytical chemistry, pharmacognosy and pharmaceutics. The students in this program receive an intensive education in the field of physical properties, mechanisms of action, admixture, dispensing and administration of drugs, and academic theories applicable to clinical practice.

Departments and Majors

School of Sports and Health

The Department of Physical Education and Dance was first opened in 1981, and the Department of Physical Education become independent in 1984. Many graduates have since become middle and high school teachers, sports-related researchers, professors, social sports organization coach, government officials, military officers, and involved in sports-related personal businesses. Starting in 2011, the department was reorganized into the School of Sports and Health that oversees the Major in Physical Education and the Major in Sports Medicine.



Major in Physical Education

The goal of the Department of Physical Education is to develop leaders in advancing various sports areas. In addition, the focus has moved from teaching physical education theory and athletics to training physical education teachers, leaders and athletes. The department was reorganized in 2006 in order to provide students with theoretical and practical knowledge of sports science in a more efficient environment.

Major in Sports Medicine

The Major in Sports Medicine, established in 2011, focuses on the basic theories of physical education and sports medicine and includes practical classes. Sports medicine-related work in medical institutions required for the future, as well as health-related coached, are developed through this program.

School of Music

There are five areas of specialization in this school: piano, orchestral music, vocal, composition and art management. The goal is to educate and train professional musicians who will play a vital role in modern culture. The school offers a range of courses from art management to high level music.

Department of Fine Arts

The department seeks to instill in all students aesthetic judgment, professional knowledge, collaborative skills, and technical expertise. With a firm grounding in the studio arts and through seminars, the program blends theory with creative applications in preparing graduates to become leaders in their professions.

Department of Craft Design

The Department of Craft Design of Kyungsung University opened about 30 years ago and has grown into a model craft design school in Busan and Kyungnam. The major is divided into metal art design, ceramics design, furniture design and textile design to educate professionals through a balance of art and industry. Craft Design students have many career opportunities and access to work in various fields of activity due to a complex integration of diversity, professionalism and popularity from mass design to private artist fields. As craft design is closely related to daily life, its application to culture in general through design education focused on formativeness is encouraged. Only continuous and diverse efforts enable student to have knowledge and specialties required for finding a suitable career. As concern for a better quality of life grows these days, craft art is establishing itself as a feature of a healthy approach to life.

Department of Dance

The Department of Dance was established in 1980 as part of the Physical Education and Dance Department. In 1983, it became a separate and independent major. It reformed its curriculum and modified its course framework to include more suitable and systematic study programs to meet the demands of students wanting to be successful and well-qualified dance professionals.

School of Digital Content

The School of Digital Content has been established to train professional human resource assets in such areas in Korea. CT covers planning, producing and marketing Culture Content. Our goal is to train professionals who can produce various genres of content by combining creative stories and digital technology. This school is the specialized major for Culture Content. Under the title NURI (New University for Regional Innovation), the school has received a 3 billion won annual government grant for 5 years This school is famous for job-oriented education that includes industry participation, various content producing equipment and infrastructure, international certificate courses, international student exchange programs, and industry/ university cooperation.

Major in Digital Image

The mission of the undergraduate major in Digital Moving Image is to educate students in the art, craft, and technology of digital media including digital television, interactive media, video and mobile in the processes of pre-production, production, post-production. Our goals include the development of individual talent and skills for the One-Person-Production-System. Necessary skills for that system, such as writing, directing, camera-shooting, editing and graphics, are covered in our programs. We encourage students to become creative and thoughtful practitioners in the world of media. We also support a strong internship program offering a wide range of options for a professional job.

Major in Digital Animation

Animation, character and game industries are key fields in culture content that have emerged as higher value-added businesses in the 21st century. Nowadays, as media change so rapidly, there is a demand for creative production personnel who can work in all facets production whether it is TV animation, computer game animation, comics publishing, animation for mobile and clay animation. We aim at training high quality people who have a highly theoretical approach and capacity to produce animation using traditional drawing methods, as well as digital technology. We provide an on-site practice-based education with the related companies.

Major in Digital Media

This major trains professionals who can plan and produce new types of media services according to the rapid change of media environments, such as ubiquitous media content (WiBro, mobile internet service, DMB, smart phone), interactive TV content, Artificial Intelligence content, Emotional content, Virtual Reality content, Social Network Service (SNS), and Home network content in the era of Digital Life. These kinds of newly emerging media and content require rapid adaptation to the New Media, which continually changes according to the development of information and communication technologies, boundless imaginations, innovative minds and challenging spirits. The Digital Media major has set a goal to nurture professionals in the area of Convergence Media, which overcomes the limitations of existing media.



Department of Theater and Film

The Department Of Film and Theatre at Kyungsung University was established in 1982 and has produced the majority of film makers, actors and actresses. The department trains talented students who will be the center of the culture entertainment industry through a professional education and the maintenance of a mutual organic relationship. The program includes have field-oriented courses and the highest level of practical training facilities in Busan to train experts who will lead visual arts and film.

Department of Visual Communication Design

The Visual Communication Design Department helps students understand the importance of visual language that is used as a communication method in an information-oriented society. The department develops talented professional designers who can effectively adapt themselves to the historical flow of new media and multimedia. The department helps students not only with their understanding of the information-oriented world, but with the ability to identify leading design fields with a future-oriented perspective by teaching computer skills and the latest information.

Department of Interior Design

The purpose of the Interior Design Department is to create living environments that develop culture by recognizing the importance of space design in the given time. Its major subjects include living space, industrial space, exhibition space, cruise interior designs and special space, virtual space and high-tech designs which design future-oriented high tech space. The department develops creative professional designers who can effectively adapt to 21st century limitless competition and the new media culture by reinforcing practice-oriented education.



Department of Product Design

Product design is a future-oriented high-tech design area. It deals with the planning and designing of attractive and convenient products using consumer information and technologies. We aim to develop talented and competitive designers by training students with emotional and practical training methods and a high-tech multimedia education. The curriculum includes information-technology, sociology, design-planning, design-marketing, human-engineering, production-processes and management skill training for a design business mind.

Department of Mass Communication

The educational objective of the Mass Communication Department is to train skillful journalists as reporters, program directors and news casters who are considered as power elites and take the lead in the information society. The educational scope of the department may range from traditional media, such as newspaper and TV, to digital media, such as Internet-based media, DMB or satellite broadcasting. The department has been known as the pioneer of journalist training programs among the mass communication academic institutions in South Korea comprised of expert faculty members and high-tech facilities.

Department of Advertising & PR(Public Relations)

The Department of Advertising and Public Relations prepares students to be strategic and creative thinkers and decision makers in the fields of advertising, public relations and mass communication. The department is dedicated to providing students with an excellent education that emphasizes practical knowledge and experience as well as theoretical foundations of the field. The department offers an undergraduate degree in advertising and public relations and participates in master's and doctoral programs of the College of Mass Communication.

Department of Photography

In this knowledge and information society, photography is situated in the core field of a language of image and is a practical study that has infinite applications. Departments and Majors

Department of Chinese Language & Literature

Since then, the Department has continuously developed and established master's and doctorate programs in the General Graduate School and a master's program in the Graduate School of Education. In 2011, the Department of Chinese Language and Literature was made an independent School of Chinese Studies to better develop experts in the practical fields of Chinese studies. The College requires double majors to conduct academic activities in Chinese. A total of 1,500 graduates from the department are actively working in relevant fields as professionals throughout the world. The college includes 7 professional full-time professors, 3 visiting professors, and 3 native Chinese professors. All professors endeavor to make the students leading experts in Chinese studies. The goals of the program are promoting expert comprehension of China, high language skills, and an international sense of the new global generation connected to China.

Department of Chinese Interpretation and Translation

The College of Chinese Studies was established in 2011 and is divided into three departments. The Department of Chinese Interpretation and Translation is one department that is designed to develop globalized professionals in interpretation and translation with an have extensive knowledge in regional studies and human & social Sciences, including literature & arts, politics, economy, society and culture, as well as excellent language fluency to facilitate international communication and contribute to national development. We have confidence that ambitious students can meet any goals through a systematic curriculum that concentrates on practical and academic ideas from an experienced faculty. By developing world-class professionals in interpretation and translation, the department promotes all round overseas study and requires that students participate in hands-on training at least 4 times before graduation.
