Although there are specific podiatry subjects in the first and second years, it is in the third and fourth years when the knowledge of diagnosis, treatment and prevention, among others, is deepened. The external internships are carried out in different private centres and the Teaching Assistance Unit located at the Faculty, during the third and fourth years, under the supervision of clinical and academic tutors. Finally, in the 4th year, the Final Degree Project is carried out, where students integrate the knowledge of the degree oriented to Podiatry.

Classes, seminars on the subjects and external practices are held in the morning and afternoon.
