

ANNEX I TO THE BUSINESS COLLABORATION AGREEMENT FOR ACTIVITIES OF GENERAL INTEREST SUBSCRIBED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF MALAGA AND JOSÉ ANTONIO SIERRA LUMBRERAS (Sponsorship)

RULES OF THE AWARD

Article 1. Purpose

Mr. José Antonio Sierra Lumbreras and the University of Malaga, through the María Zambrano Center for Transatlantic Studies UMA - ATECH, to encourage research and awakening interest in relations between Spain and Ireland in any academic or scientific discipline, announce the Spain-Ireland Awards of the María Zambrano Center for Transatlantic Studies.

Article 2. Requirements for candidates

The competition is open to teachers, students, journalists, and researchers from all over the world.

Article 3. Requirements for submissions

George Campbell Award

- 1. The research works must consider the relations between Spain and Ireland in areas such as arts, music, or sports. These themes are based on the personal interests of George Campbell.
- 2. The report must include the following sections: title, abstract, keywords, introduction, main text, results (if required), conclusions, and references.
- 3. The length of the document must be fewer than 150 pages. Appendixes and the reference section (bibliography) will not be taken into account for this figure.
- 4. The following format must be used: Word document format; font type: Times New Roman 12; line spacing: 1.5; right and left margins: 3 cm; upper and lower margins: 2.5 cm; page size: A4.
- 5. Research works may be written in the English or Spanish language.
- 6. Research works should not have been previously published or awarded.

Robert Boyd Award

- 1. The research works must consider the historical relations between Spain and Ireland.
- 2. The report must include the following sections: title, abstract, keywords, introduction, main text, results (if required), conclusions, and references.
- 3. The length of the document must be fewer than 150 pages. Appendixes and the reference section (bibliography) will not be taken into account for this figure.



- 4. The following format must be used: Word document format; font type: Times New Roman 12; line spacing: 1.5; right and left margins: 3 cm; upper and lower margins: 2.5 cm; page size: A4.
- 5. Research works may be written in the English or Spanish language.
- 6. Research works should not have been previously published or awarded.
- 7. Some examples of possible topics for the research works include: Celtic civilization, Irish schools in Spain, the Spanish Armada, the Irish involvement in the Spanish Civil War, etc., and any other topic about the historical relations between Spain and Ireland deemed relevant by the authors.

Kate O'Brien Award

- 1. This award will be given to a journalistic or literary work that deals about the relations between Spain and Ireland.
- 2. Both written and audiovisual works will be accepted.
- 3. Each submission must include a short report with, at least, the following sections: title and abstract.
- 4. The following format must be followed for literary works: Word document format; font type: Times New Roman 12; line spacing: 1.5; right and left margins: 3 cm; upper and lower margins: 2.5 cm; page size: A4.
- 5. Research works may be written in the English or Spanish language.
- 6. Journalistic submissions should be previously published or broadcasted in media. Literary works must be previously unpublished and not previously awarded.
- 7. Special consideration will be given to those works developed from a gender perspective.

Article 4. Prizes

The total prize for each edition and category will be €1,200. The following prizes will be granted:

- €1,200 for the best submission in each category.
- Second prize for the second-best submission in each category.

Article 5. Applications

Applications must be sent by regular mail to the following address:

Submissions must include the following documents:

- 1. Application for participation
- 2. Work to be considered
- 3. ID copy (Spanish DNI, national ID document, passport, or similar)
- 4. Short résumé

The deadline for applications is 9 months to be counted from the day after publication of this document on www.uma.es/amzet.

Article 6. Evaluation

All applications meeting the described requirements and within the established deadline will be assessed by a commission made up of the following members:

- The Head of the María Zambrano Center for Transatlantic Studies (or the person delegated by them)
- Two Ph.D. Professors from the University of Malaga
- The International Advisor of the María Zambrano Center for Transatlantic Studies
- Two members of Irish universities or institutions

The results of the Evaluation Committee will be published on the website mentioned above. Likewise, the winners will receive an email notification.

Plagiarism and/or the concealment, modification, or manipulation of data shall constitute grounds for dismissal of the application.
