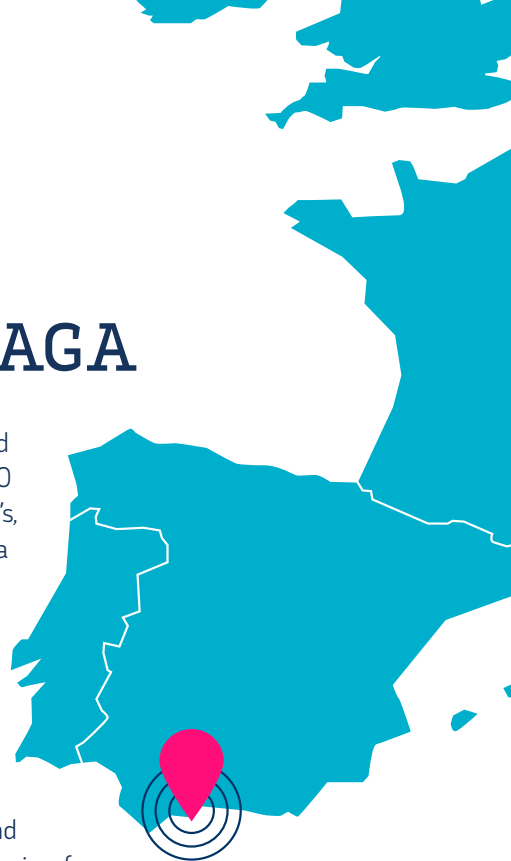
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UNIVERSITY OF MALAGA

Founded in 1972, the University of Malaga (UMA) is a young and dynamic university with more than 35,000 students and 2,400 teachers. UMA's degree programmes comprise around 60 Bachelor's, 60 Master's and over 20 PhD courses taught at 18 faculties with a total of 81 departments spread over two campuses.

The University of Malaga is firmly committed to its international dimension and takes part in the ERASMUS+ programme funded by the European Union, international mobility programmes such as ISEP, PIMA and holds a wide range of bilateral mobility agreements with universities from all over the world. These mobility programmes together with international projects and international cooperation projects in developing countries are the basis of UMA's internationalization policy.

With around 550 ERASMUS+ partner universities all over Europe and around 180 partner universities worldwide, UMA receives each year more than 1,600 international exchange students and sends more than 1,000 UMA students abroad. MALAGA

With one of the warmest climates in Europe, an abundance of sunshine and a rich and diverse landscape made up of coastal areas, mountains and agricultural plains, the Costa del Sol is renowned for its great quality of life, beaches and outstanding natural beauty and scenery.

Malaga is the capital of the Costa del Sol and the 6th biggest city in Spain with a rich historic and cultural tradition. It was founded by the Phoenicians around 800 B.C. and later colonised by Iberians, Greeks, Romans, Arabs and Christians. Its privileged position on the shores of the Mediterranean has meant that the city has sustained excellent trade and cultural relations throughout its history.

Nowadays, Malaga is a modern, cosmopolitan and welcoming city with around 600,000 inhabitants and has successfully developed its commercial, industrial and tourist sectors. With its historical treasures such as the Moorish Alcazaba and Roman Theatre, a wide variety of museums and theatres, Malaga is becoming more and more recognised as an important cultural tourism destination. Over the last decades Picasso's birth-town has gone on leaps and bounds to develop its cultural and leisure landscape, along with its great Mediterranean gastronomy, making it easily one of the most enriching and enjoyable places to visit in Southern Spain.

■ STUDY ABROAD AT UMA

UMA accepts international exchange students nominated by partner universities in the study areas and levels stipulated in our Erasmus+ or other mobility programme agreements. A minimum of 50% of courses have to be selected at the faculty stipulated in the agreement.

The University's academic year runs from September/October to June/July and is divided into two semesters with an exam period in February for first term courses and another exam period in late June/July for annual and second term courses. ■ SPANISH LANGUAGE COURSES

UMA's language of instruction is Spanish. International students should have a minimum B1 level of Spanish to start their studies. UMA offers Spanish courses at the beginning of September (first semester and full year students) and at the beginning of February (second semester students) at the Centro Internacional de Español (International Centre for Spanish). Founded in 1947, the CIE-UMA offers monthly, all level Spanish courses for international students, promoting multicultural integration and facilitating a dynamic sociolinguistic immersion in the city of Malaga. Exchange students enjoy an enriching experience in the classrooms and surrounding area of the International Center for Spanish, which is located very close to the beach.
